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HE Richard Morris Meets Students Leaving on Winter Camp to UK



The British Ambassador to Nepal His Excellency Mr. Richard C. Morris has met with the ABAN executives, represented by vice -president Mr. Tulasi Prasad Uprety and general secretary Mr. Uttam Prasad Pant, and also interacted with the 52 young students from six schools of Kathmandu on January 8, 2018 at the ambassador's residence at Lazimpat.

The students and team leaders were travelling to the UK on January 16 to attend a two weeks long cultural exchange program designed to help promote British Education and increase the cultural horizons of the participating children.

The group meeting the ambassador included 62 people including 52 students, 4 team leaders, 3 ULCI staff, 2 ABAN members and 1 photographer. The six participating students are from six schools of Kathmandu, namely Galaxy Public, Bouddha Meridian, Learning Realm, International, Campaign, Brihaspati Vidya Sadan and St. Xavier's school.

A joint initiative between the British Council and the Department for International Development (DFID), Connecting Classrooms is designed to help young people develop the knowledge, skills and values to live and work in a globalised economy, and make a positive contribution locally and globally. The programme, running from 2015-2018, will build the capacity of 45,000 teachers and 12,000 school leaders worldwide to support them to integrate a range of core skills into the curriculum, with a focus on:

- Digital literacy, Critical thinking and problem solving
- Creativity and imagination, Student leadership.
- Collaboration and communication, Citizenship

More than five million pupils worldwide will benefit from a global education program connecting UK classrooms to over 30 countries around the world. Connecting Classrooms aims to improve teaching in both the UK and other countries in the key areas: **Professional development** for teachers and school leaders in over 30 countries including the UK

Sustainable partnership between schools in the UK and over 30 countries in Middle East, Sub Saharan Africa, South & East Asia.

Professional dialogue for policy makers that will support national and regional level debate, reflection and action;

Awards to schools, which are successful in equipping young people with the knowledge and skills to live and work in a globalized economy.

The first phase of Connecting Classrooms ran from June 2012 to June 2015, focused on building global awareness and cross-cultural learning amongst young people and enabled over 18,000 teachers around the world to benefit from professional development training, with over 70% of schools reporting improvements to global citizenship teaching practice as a result.
