Tenth Executive Committee Meeting Approves New Members



Tenth Executive Committee meeting of ABAN held on May 5, 2018 under the chairmanship of President Maheswor Bhakta Shrestha discussed the following agenda items:

- 1) 20th AGM and Magazine 2018,
- 2) Bank balance and fund transfer,
- 3) Renewal of ABAN Registrations.
- 4) Approval of New Members

The meeting resolved to express hearty condolence to Treasurer Mr. Hariom Dhoj Joshi on the sad demise of his father Mr. Hari Krishna Dhoj Joshi on Baisakh 11, 2075 at the age of 96 years.

2.1 20th AGM and Magazine 2018

20th AGM of ABAN on February 4 was very successfully concluded within the approved budget of Rs.70,000/-. The accounts of ABAN Magazine 2018 was reported to have generated advertising income of Rs.118,750 plus Rs.40,000 receivable from two advertisers. The printing cost of the Magazine of Rs.157,061 was reimbursed by the British Council.



2.2 Bank Balance & Transfer

ABAN fund in bank accounts totaled Rs.1,462,290.11 (Rs.112,290.11 in saving and Rs.1,350,000 in fixed deposits). As Mega bank account bear no interest, an amount of Rs.45,000 will be transferred from Mega Bank to NB Bank account, which pays 6% interest per annum.

2.3 Renewal of ABAN Registrations
Lawyer Mr. Radha Krishna Bhandari, who had helped ABAN for renewal of its registration in the past has been requested to process renewal of registration again, and has been advanced Rs.5,000/- to pay for TDS and other expenses.

2.4 Approval of New Members:

Application of 3 new members proposed by Mr. Uttam Lal Pradhan for Life Membership has been scrutinized and approved:


- Mr. Naresh Man Shakya, M. Sc. Engineering Geology from the University of New Castle Upon Tyne in 1996-97,

Call for Application for ISA 2018-19



The British Council Nepal and the Government of Nepal, Department of Education announces submission of expression of interest from schools in Nepal to participate in the International Schools Award (ISA) for 2018-19. Schools from across Nepal meeting the eligibility criteria can download the application form and procedure from the download section to participate in the ISA.

What is International School Award (ISA)?

ISA is a yearly award given to participating schools. Applications from interested schools are called in every year, August/September period and schools are selected on the basis of their application. The British Council offers the ISA as an accreditation framework for schools to record and evaluate their international work and embed it into the curriculum. ISA acts as a benchmark that ascertains schools as having an outstanding level of support for:

- •Nurturing global citizenship in young people,
- Enriching teaching and learning

The ISA approach to school development is holistic and mirrors the curriculum based project work approach to encourage the teachers to use with their students. It is rigorous and evidence based process. It encourages the leaders to foster teambuilding, innovation, and project management. ISA gives context to practice new skills in Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and pedagogy in a safe and structured manner. Participating in briefings and workshops, online community and the award ceremony brings together a large number of schools across the country fostering rich exchange of ideas and creating a vibrant community of education professionals.

Evaluation process

Representatives from the British Council, Department of Education and Curriculum Development Centre evaluate the portfolio of evidence submitted by the participating schools and visit schools to see the authenticity of the work and learning outcomes in the children. With the evidences submitted and the school visits, the schools are granted the award.

Nepal's ambassador to United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland HE Dr. Durga Bahadur Subedi addressed young Nepali students visiting UK on a cultural exchange program in London recently. Dr. Subedi is 20th Nepali ambassador in UK since September 29, 2016 and is the Life Member of ABAN since October 27, 2017.

The diplomatic relations between Nepal and UK was started soon after the 1816 treaty of Sugauli. UK is one of the biggest bilateral development partner of Nepal. The relation has extended up to people to people level as Mount Sagarmatha, the world's highest peak in Nepal was first climbed by a British.

ABAN General Secretary Mr. Uttam Pant took a group of students from Galaxy, St. Xavior, LRI and other schools to UK to expose them with British educational, cultural and historic traditions as a good foundation for shaping their future.
