## 23rd ABAN DAY Celebrated



The Association of British Alumni in Nepal has celebrated 23<sup>rd</sup> ABAN DAY on February 4, 2021, the Day when the Association was registered with the District Office in 1998.

First Honorary Member of ABAN Dr. Mrigendra Raj Pandey, presently in Singapore serves as Chief Guest of the event, attended by some 36 members from Nepal and abroad, while 10 members regretted to have missed this online zoom event for their own reasons.

"Greetings and thanks to all participants on this occasion of the 23rd ABAN Day today. Brirish alu8mni atre in the highest position in the government. We must be mindful of how we are using the skill and knowledge of British education in Nepal. In my own case, I studied in UK for 4 years and was the first Nepali to gain MRCP and FRCP from UK. Although I studied as a British Council scholar, I was motivated by the Nepalese people to work for them and repay my due. So came back home, had the opportunity to work in the remotest

area like Jumla.and later established Mrigendra Samjhana Medical Trust (MSMT) by donating my own property and to offer free health services to the needy people of Nepal.

For the last 3 years, the Trust is working with ABAN to serve the senior citizens of Tapasthali Bhridhashram in Budhanilkantha and Nishahaya Sewa Kendra in Baneswor to meet some of their pressing needs. It has been a wonderful experience. So, I wish for the greater success of ABAN".


Leading ABAN professionals are interviewed with video coverage for digital archive. It glorifies the works done by British Alumni to develop Nepal.
