ABAN Serves Senior Citizens of Nishahaya Sewa Sadan, Baneshwor



Association of British Alumni in Nepal (ABAN) is a not-for-profit social organization affiliated with the British Council, active for the welfare of the Nepalese, who studied in UK and pursue an interest in the socio-economic development of Nepal. ABAN also works for the cultural and educational exchange between Nepal and Britain.

Association of British Alumni in Nepal- ABAN executive members visited the Center for Service to the Helpless (Nishahaya Sewa Sadan) at Baneshwor on December 26, 2015 and handed over foodstuffs and 25 different types of medicine, as listed by the Center. This is as part of the Association's regular service to the senior citizens in the wake of the cold season that trouble them most.

ABAN president Maheswor Bhakta Shrestha and other executive members present on the occasion handed over the dry food items packed for each of the 42 resident senior citizens and medicines for their clinic and lintels (16 kgs) and cocking oil 8 litres to the Center. The total cost of Rs.24,000/- was contributed by the 11 executive members of ABAN.

Cultural and Social Service Sub-committee chair Mrs. Padma Vaidya coordinated the support activities, while another executive

member Mr. Punya Prasad Paudel arranged supply of medicines. This sub-committee is one of eight sub committees (namely, Health & Medical, Educational, Program, Publications, membership, Networking and Fund Raising) plus an Advisory Council, who are actively engaged in fulfilling the objectives of ABAN.

The senior citizens, mostly ladies of 65 to 90 years of age, were very appreciative of the support, while Mr. Karuna Govinda Shrestha, Vice president and Mrs. Ratneswori Pradhan, Coordinator and joint secretary of the Center thanked ABAN and its members for the goodwill gesture extended and were hopeful of such support in the future as well. This was the second occasion ABAN has helped the Center, previously with the warm clothing (sweaters) back in 2007.

The Center, located at the bank of Bagmati

river near Tinkune, was initiated in 1991, with foundation stone laid by former prime minister Mr. Krishna Prasad Bhattarai. The building was inaugurated after 4 years, on August 17, 1995 by the donor Mr. Udaya Lal Shrestha, who donated one million rupees for

constructing the building.

The Center is operational for the



past 2 decades in serving the helpless or abandoned aged people from different parts of the country. Presently, the Center is supported by over 400 life members contributing over Rs.5,000 each and other donors. New facilities added are morning yoga



4rth Executive Meeting of ABAN on December 17, 2015



ABAN President Mr. Maheswor Bhakta Shrestha called the fourth meeting of the 9th Executive Committee on December 17 in the presence of IPP Shanker Prasad Paudel, Vice President Mr. Tulasi Prasad Uprety, General Secretary Mr. Uttam Pant, Treasurer Mr. Hariom Dhoj Joshi and Members Mrs. Rupa Basnet, Mrs. Padma Vaidya, Mr. Madhav Prasad Bhatta and Mr. Punya Prasad Paudel:

Treasurer's Report:

- a) Audit Reports: Mrs. Rupa Basnet handed over the Auditor's reports of FY 2069/70, 2070/71 and 2071/72 BS to Treasurer Mr. Hariom Dhoj Joshi. An updated statement of receipts and payments until Poush 2072 together with bank statement, cheque books etc. would be handed over in the next meeting.
- b) Bank account signatories: With the change of ABAN Executive Committee members, the meeting decided to change the signatories to operate the bank accounts in Nepal Bangladesh Bank, Mega Bank and NMB Bank as follows: Either one among the President Maheswor B Shrestha or Vice President Mr. Tulasi P. Uprety plus either one among Treasurer Hariom D. Joshi or Asst. Treasurer Mrs. Shiba Devi Kafle will sign.
- c) Receivables: The latest balance sheet showed a Receivables of Rs.12,477/- . IPP Shankar P. Paudel was requested to expedite its collection and report for action in the next meeting.
- 2. Membership:

The meeting approved new Life Membership to:

- 1) Mr. Govinda Neupane (ID no. 493) introduced by Maheswor Shrestha,
- 2) Mr. Janak Sharma Paudel (ID no. 494) introduced by Mr. Tulasi Uprety

Each ECN member will try to introduce eligible new members, Ordinary members will be converted into Life Members by collecting Rs.2,000/each (Rs.1600 life membership fee plus Rs.400 contribution). - 3. - Updating of Statute: Mrs. Rupa Basnet will update the ABAN Statute 2064 incorporating subsequent amendments for a fresh printing.


