He earned his Ph.D. degree in the UK with a thesis on applying Sen's capability approach in studying the nature and extent of poverty in East Nepal.

Dr. Pant came to Kathmandu for higher study in 1975. Later he worked in UK Aid projects in East Nepal during 1979-1985, and went to UK in 1986 for post graduate study. Then he came back to Nepal and worked in various international organizations during 1987-1990. He set up a charity and worked with "Dalits" in Parbat district, western Nepal during 1990-93. Dr. Pant went to the UK again in 1993 for PhD study in Development Studies and stayed there for the past 27 years.


